Guide to Completing CQM Livestock Treatment Records

Valid Expiry: If the drug is still within its expiry date put a check mark. Only valid drugs should be used for treatment.

Route of Treatment:

IM = in the musle (intramuscular)

SQ = under the skin (subcutaneous)

IMM = in the udder (intramammary)

IV = in the vein (intravenous)

OR = in the mouth (oral)

TP = on the skin (topical)

IU = in the uterus (intrauterine)

Broken Needles: If no broken needle respond N/No. If there is a broken needle in the animal respond Y/Yes, and record the site of the broken needle as below.

R = Rump

F = Flank

N = Neck

Additional Days of Treatment: If the animal is treated for more than 5 days add the treatments in the space provided. Any treatments that are beyond what is specified on the label require a script from the veterinarian. For more information regarding the definition of extra-label drug use please contact your veterinarian.

Residue Test: As per CQM, testing is only required for new animals (alternately a letter of guarantee from the previous owner is acceptable). This space can also be used for residue testing (ie. Delvo Test) done on animals following extended treatment prescribed by the veterinarian.

POS = Animal tested positive on residue test

NEG = Animal tested negative on residue test

NA = Not Applicable (Animal not tested)
